“The Faith” Once Delivered To the Saints

Frequently in the inspired text we read of a peculiar phrase called “the faith.” Often times this phrase is misunderstood and misapplied by the religious community. When the Bible mentions “the faith,” it is in reference to the Christian belief system. “The faith” is what is believed rather than the act of believing. When belief is used without the definite article, it is the act of believing. When the word faith has the definite article, it refers to the truth that is believed. The faith is a distinctive body of truth that must be obeyed, and governs the behavior of Christians in the house of God known also as the church. The scriptures provide some relevant information in regards to the faith.

The faith is to be obeyed (Acts 6:7). To obey “the faith” is synonymous with obeying the Gospel, the Christian belief system. Notice that the text does not say they were obedient to “faith,” but it says obedient to “the faith.” To obey “the faith” is to obey a specific body of truth. Furthermore, “the faith” can be preached (Gal. 1:23). If it is not preached, it cannot be obeyed. Paul after his conversion began to preach “the faith.” In addition, one can depart from “the faith” (1 Tim 4:1). Those who abandon the Christian belief system in word or practice have departed from the faith. Moreover, Christians can continue in the faith (Acts 14:22). Those of us who are Christians must remain faithful to “the faith” by continuing in the apostle’s doctrine (Acts 2:42). A comparative study of Acts 14:22 to Acts 2:42 will reveal that “the faith” and the “Apostles doctrine” are synonymous. Finally, Christians are to contend for “the faith” (Jude 3). We must be willing as children of God to meet any and all challenges to the faith in hopes of exposing error.

Let us be ever mindful of the importance of the faith. It is that body of truth, which governs the practices of all Christians. If it can not be found in “the faith,” then it is not divinely authorized. May it be when the Lord descends from the bosom of Heaven that we can echo the words of the Apostle Paul while he was in the final stages of life, “I fought a good fight, I finished my course, I have kept the faith.”
